



Go Team RMD!

Teamwork is easy to recognize where it exists, but hard to define where it doesn't.

One definition I've read is: two or more people moving along a path of interaction toward a common goal.

The motion passed at the EC meeting on November 12, 2012 was a registration fee of \$95, after May I the registration fee would be \$110, and the spouse and one day rate would be set at \$50.





The Creation of Woman

Recently, I gave a topic at our LWML society's quarterly meeting. The topic was, "The Creation of Woman." For this topic I used Genesis, chapters 1-3.

It is important to note that when God created anything, He declared it to be "good." Clouds were created "good." Grass was created "good." Animals were created "good." Fish were created "good." Day and night were created "good." It was all "good" and God said it was. So it stands to reason, on the sixth day, when man and woman were created, it was also "good." Of course, this "good" was more than just pleasing, it meant it was perfect and it was holy just as God is holy and perfect. All was in order and all was well.

The creation of man and woman on the sixth day came in two parts. First, there was the creation of Adam. God made Him and left Him alone in the world. Now, he was not really alone, Adam just didn't know where his mate was to be found. After looking over the animals, naming them, and seeing their mates, he didn't find anyone suitable for himself.

Could it be God had forgotten him? Not at all. God just wanted Adam to know how special he was and how special his mate would be. We are told, Adam fell into a deep sleep and God took out a rib and behold woman was formed. And, as you might know, it was "good."

What does this have to do with the LWML? I'm glad you asked. Eve was Adam's helper, the one who made him and his work complete. With Eve, Adam could now accomplish what God wanted him to do. With Eve, Adam could feel a wholeness. With Eve, his wife, Adam and Eve would again be "one flesh." It took both to be what the Father had wanted for His creation so that He would see it as "good." Adam needed Eve and Eve needed Adam; together they were as God intended.

In the Church, we find too many struggling with who we are and what are our roles. I do believe God has given us unique gifts and abilities. I also know we can do more than one task. I also believe God has a created order for His world, and if we live with His order in our homes and churches, we will find things work better. However, I never assumed God thought Adam was better than Eve or Eve than Adam. Since both were formed of the same elements and blessed by God in the same way and really were one flesh before being separated, in God's eyes both were important, equally important. They were His children and they were alive spiritually.

But there was a major problem. Sin entered the world when Adam and Eve became

confused about their roles. No longer perfect they struggled and this struggle has continued to this day. Try as we may, we are not naturally pleasing and certainly not "good." Because of the failure to keep the proper focus, Adam and Eve destroyed what God intended for His creation. They brought death and all death causes in our homes, communities, and world. There is no path back to where God wants without the hope that the Father provides in and through His Son. This message must get out into the world for people to be saved.

The LWML is not an organization of women competing with anyone. The purpose and tasks of the LWML are God's plan for them, and their reason to exist is to serve Him and to declare His mercy and grace to all. The LWML is to focus on how this work can be done as women serve their Lord in the ways the Lord would desire. The goal must not be any other than humble service for the King of kings. But, this is to be the goal of all in service to Him, not just for our women. Our work is not competing with each other but working in harmony as God's family in sharing Christ. Humility causes us to allow the Holy Spirit to use us and in service to bring glory to our God. As Jesus would tell us, "Whoever would be great among you must be your servant."
