



Go Mighty Mites!

At this time of year, two questions are on the minds of many LWML women:

1. What are the rest of the details about convention?
2. Will we reach our mite goal to fund all our grants?

1. **Convention Registration is open and waiting for you!** Spread the word so that everyone you know comes, stays, and takes part in a really fantastic convention! Look on page 1 of this issue to see all the great events and people planned for this convention. Don't miss it!

In my November article I mentioned that we'll be doing some bylaw changes. In my January article was a reminder that convention is the only time during our 2014-2016 biennium to conduct our business and pass new bylaws. Take heart, we're working to make the changes as simple and understandable as possible. Here's a preview of some of the upcoming position title changes and you'll see details about these in the May issue so all the delegates are prepared ahead of time:

- A. Delete the Vice President of Human Care title (the Human Care Committee moves under the Vice President of Gospel Outreach)
- B. Add a Vice President of Communications (to help manage our Facebook page, website, Public Relations, news alerts, the coordination of all the *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly* subscriptions, and our district newsletter the *Tidings*).
- C. Add the Committee on Teens as a standing committee
- D. Delete the title of Corresponding Secretary (that function isn't really being used)
- E. Add a Meeting Manager who coordinates all the details for each of the meetings during the biennium (this is in place of the Corresponding Sec.)

2. As we rapidly approach our mite deadline of March 31st and we talk about sending in all your mite offerings to help us reach our goal, it might be easy to think we are focused only on the dollars. Our mites have always been the backbone of our organization, but it's not all about the money; **it's about the mission!**

In these last weeks before the March 31st cutoff, let's increase our focus on being prayerful about mites and our mission grants. Let's ask God to lead our study of His word, our prayer time, and may He bless our mission grants and the mites necessary to complete vital programs for these grant recipients.

Are you ready?

The days are getting longer, and the weather is starting to warm. In the southern portions of our district, Spring is already in full bloom; here in the north, we're just starting to break out of winter.

But, in many of our households, the preparations are well underway. We look outside at the snowy - or muddy - plot of yard where our gardens belong, and eagerly await the sunshine and warmth that will melt the snow and dry the mud.

Yet, as any gardener knows, there is a lot of preparations that must take place before the harvest is ready. Seeds must be carefully planted, tended, and watered. Weeds must be pulled. Some plants need to be staked or led up a trellis; others may need additional nutrients not found in the soil.

What can we do to prepare for the harvest? We can spend more time in God's Word and less time being distracted by the ways of the world. We can pray that the Lord of the Harvest would raise up laborers of all kinds - pastors, teachers, deaconess, DCEs, lay ministers, and medical professionals - to send into his harvest. We can work to support laborers with our mites and our offerings. And we can look for opportunities in our own communities and neighborhoods to share the love of Jesus with others. Need other ideas? **Come to our convention in June!**

So let's get ready! The Harvest is being prepared!


Bible Study Leader

Lenten Devotions Available from LWML RMD

Lent is a time for repentance, humility, servanthood, and meditating on the events of Holy Week.

The following Lenten devotions are available from the district files:

All Eyes on the Cross – A devotion based on the seven last words of Christ from the Cross, featuring two narrators and the singing of several Lenten hymns, including *Come to Calvary's Holy Mountain*, *When I Survey the Wondrous Cross*, *Amazing Grace*, and ending with *Crown Him with Many Crowns*.

A Candlelight Devotion: Forgiveness for Lent – Props include one cross and one large burning candle on a table or altar. Uses 2 or more readers and group response. This devotion focuses on the cross and sins forgiven. Includes suggestions for hymns to conclude the devotion.

Foot Washers (Lent) – Based on John 13:14: *If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet.* Concludes with the hymn *Jesu, Jesu, Fill Us with Your Love* or *My Song Is Love Unknown*.

A Devotion Outline – A personal devotion to be used on the six days of Holy Week, focusing on the person of Jesus Christ, including his feet, hands, head, and side. Each day includes Scripture passages, a hymn, and a poem.

You might expect this article to be about Spring or New Beginnings but at my house March is Tax Time. 
Get Your Piece of Pie!

Joyful Response® is an electronic offering transfer service now available for our LWML Rocky Mountain District societies, zones and individual members to send in mite offerings. *Joyful Response®* is just like the automated or electronic transfers you may already use for loan or utility payments. This is a free service which allows direct contributions of mites from a designated account paid directly to the LWML RMD StewardAccount® with Lutheran Church Extension Fund. This service is for sending in mite offerings only, other contributions, such as delegate fund, *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly* subscriptions, special gifts and the like will need to be sent by check in the usual manner. Applications will be available on the LWML RMD website or by contacting LWML RMD Treasurer, Beth Nagy.

From *Treasured News*: Reaching the mission goal only for the sake of meeting our budget is based on "law giving." Gospel motivation works because ALL of life is one of stewardship. The Bible tells us about a giving God and a receiving people. How the receiving people use all that comes from a giving God is what Christian stewardship is all about. Pray about what you will give.
