



To date, the total for the biennium is \$1,849,178.96, with one district's March mites yet to be counted. In an eNews dated March 5, 2015, supporters were asked to pray, as eleven Mission Grants still required full or partial funding before the end of the fiscal biennium on March 31, 2015. After the announcement of the mites' shortfall, many districts and single donors responded with additional gifts. All praise to our Lord, Jesus Christ, for gracious giving!

# I Am

Jesus makes an extraordinary claim in John 8:48-59, “*Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am.*” His words angered the Jews, for in these words He was claiming a unity with God the Father (see Exodus 3:14). Indeed, He was claiming to be God. John’s Gospel highlights this claim of Jesus along with other “I Am” proclamations so that we may know Him. There are seven “I Am” statements found in the Gospel of John, and each one says something very significant about Jesus.

***I am the bread of life.*** *He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty.* John 6:35. Jesus is the very one who nourishes us and sustains us. We eat bread all the time, and become hungry again. Jesus, who is our spiritual nourishment, removes all hunger and thirst forever. The life He gives us goes on and on.

***I am the light of the world.*** *Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.* John 8:12. Wherever there is light, the darkness is going to scatter. Jesus has illuminated for us the divine truth of God’s forgiveness and grace and scattered the dark gloom of our sin and despair. We no longer need to fear the threat of death that terrorized us in the darkness.

***I am the gate for the sheep.*** *All who ever came before me were thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out, and find pasture.* John 10:7-9. Jesus is the one who keeps His sheep safe, assuring us that by entering through Him, we will not be harmed by the thief or the robber. He lovingly protects the sheep of his fold.

***I am the good shepherd.*** *The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.* John 10:11. So great is Jesus’ love for us that He is willing to give His own life. However, this is much

more than just dying in the line of duty. The Shepherd who lays down his life has become our substitute in death.


***I am the resurrection and the life.*** *He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.* John 11:25-26. We could in no way hope for a resurrection on our own. Death is a foe far too strong for us to defeat. However, for Jesus, death is no match. All who trust in Jesus have the promise of life forevermore.

***I am the way and the truth and the life.*** *No one comes to the Father except through me.* John 14:6. In a world that wants to claim so many paths to God, Jesus assures us that He alone gives access to the Father. He does not say He shows us the way, but that He actually is the way.

***I am the vine; you are the branches.*** *If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.* John 15:5. In order for a branch to remain alive, it must be connected to the vine. The evidence of life is the fruit that grows. Jesus produces the fruit of faith in us. All the words and works in our lives that delight God are result of Jesus, the vine, who remains in us.

I encourage you to take some time to study and reflect on each one of these statements in more depth. The “I Am” statements of Jesus are a great comfort for us. We know that He truly is the “I Am,” God Himself. Jesus is the Alpha and the Omega, who is and who was and who is to come (Revelation 1:8). Indeed our very life and existence is found in Him alone.

### Orphan Grain Train

Orphan Grain Train is a Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. Grain Train volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. The Orphan Grain Train movement is a loving response to Jesus Christ's example as a servant and His love for us.

- School Kits:** backpack, 2-3 spiral notebooks (any size), 2 or more pencils, 2 or more pens, pkg. of construction paper, crayons, ruler, glue sticks, blunt scissors, washable markers, protractor
- Hygiene Kits:** 1 bath towel, 1 wash cloth, 1 bath-size bar of soap, 1 adult-size toothbrush, 1 sturdy comb, 1 stick deodorant (optional), 6 Band-Aids (1/2" or 3/4") secured together
- Wrapping instructions:** Spread the towel flat, fold over about 5" on each long side of the towel, place everything in the center between the folds, roll up the towel, use strong ribbon or cord and tie at both ends.
- Completed quilts of any size

### Lutherans For Life

Lutherans For Life (LFL) is about speaking the truth of life—about **Bringing Good News to Life**. LFL applies the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the life issues, making Jesus known as the Son of God and Savior of all who can help and make a difference in people's lives.

The following items may be handmade:

- Hot neck wraps\* (*wraps filled with rice or dry beans for heating in microwave*)
- Shawls
- Undershirts (sleeveless)
- Decorative pillows (to clutch, prop up, or brighten a room)
- Scarves (useful for folks who have lost a lot of weight and whose clothes are ill fitting)

### \*Simple Neck Wrap Directions

#### Supplies for two wraps:

- 1/4 yard flannel (please use adult appropriate patterns)
- 8 cups rice or dried beans

#### Directions:

1. Cut fabric in half to make two pieces, about 9" x 20".
2. Sew fabric, folded in half right sides together, on a short end and the long side.
3. Flip and fill with 4 cups rice or beans. Do not over fill or the wrap will not mold well around neck.
4. Sew open end.

Note: It would be good to double sew all seams to ensure no leaks.
