

# Gleanings From Sylvia

# Reflections on the 2015 LWML Convention

It was a joy to attend the 2015 LWML Convention in Des Moines, IA. The convention theme, as you well know, was: Bountiful! Sow - Nourish - Reap. As I entered the convention floor I could see the stage had been decorated appropriately with pots, flowers and soil all around. In the center was a cross filled with good soil. Over the course of the convention I watched this display change, as from that good soil green leaves began to grow, then full stalks of corn appeared, and finally it was harvested and only the stumps remained. As I watched this transformation I couldn't help but think upon one of my favorite hymns: "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come." The second stanza reads:

All the world is God's own field, Fruit unto his praise to yield; Wheat and tares together sown, Unto joy or sorrow grown. First the blade and then the ear, Then the full corn shall appear. Lord of harvest, grant that we Wholesome grain and pure may be. (LSB 892:2)

It was great to be gathered for worship, devotions and Bible study throughout the convention. Each day our gathering focused on the convention theme: Bountiful! Sow – Nourish – Reap. It is through God's Word planted in us that He has brought us to faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, and it is through his Word that he continues to sustain us in this faith and life. To hear His Word proclaimed in the worship services, sing hymns that are rich in the proclamation of God's love, and to be in His Word together was time well spent.

One of the most enjoyable parts of the convention was the surprise of running into

so many people that I know and love, but haven't seen for a long time. Just walking around the convention center created opportunities for a reunion with someone from my past. How good it was to see some familiar faces. Several classmates from both my undergraduate and seminary days were around. I even had the joy of seeing my childhood pastor and his wife (Pastor Jim and Mona Mueller). I have very good memories of Pastor and Mona Mueller. It was Pastor Mueller who taught me the catechism and confirmed me in the faith so many years ago. He played an important role in my decision to become a pastor. ### Ysleta—Mariachi San Pablo

From our Mariachi San Pablo friends at Ysleta -



The group performed 31 of its goal of 40 summer community care serenades, many of them performed at local nursing homes and assisted living facilities, reaching approximately 800 people. This included a belated June birthday visit to the home of 101 year old Eugenia Delgado.



In July, the group travelled to Lodi and Sacramento, CA for concerts. Their 15 day summer tour had them performing in Houston, TX, Mobile, AL, Immokee and Jacksonville, FL as well as providing all the music for the 5th LCMS Hispanic Convention in Tampa.

Summer performances ended in Albuquerque, NM, playing for congregations at Immanuel and Christ Lutheran Churches. Hundreds more people were touched by these appearances.

The LWML RMD \$8000 mission grant for Mariachi San Pablo has been paid in full, thanks to all you wonderful ladies sending in those Mites!

## Mission Goal for 2015-2017 Biennium: \$2,000,000

As part of that goal the Navajo Mission received a \$75,000 dollar grant: **Hope and Healing to the Navajo People,** To implement Gospel-oriented programs for Navajo men, women, and youth to empower and equip them to live victoriously in the midst of their circumstances and to be overcomers, offering better choices for a brighter future. Programs to include: youth camps, after-school enrichment programs, Boys/Girls clubs, trips to share faith with another Native people group, men's Bible group, abused women support group, and women's health education.

What a joy it was to attend the 36<sup>th</sup> Biennial Convention in Iowa where our theme was based on 2 Corinthians 9:8. "And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good

work." Rev. Michael Mattil started the Bible study asking approximately 4,500 women, "What is your task?" He said that our real job should always be planting the seed and that we should let our actions speak loudly of loving Christ!



Looking for some new ideas to "pep up" your personal devotions or your LWML meetings and activities? Then check out some of the new materials available in the LWML Catalog.

Three new Mustard Seed Devotions are available: "In Times of Need" shares messages of encouragement for times of need; "The Word: Wisdom for Living" is based on passages from the Bible's wisdom literature; and "The Race of Faith" uses analogies from running/jogging with appropriate Bible passages. Coming soon will be a fourth new Mustard Seed Devotion, "Everyday Celebrations". Remember that some of the older Mustard Seed Devotions can also be ordered in large print.

New Bible studies and devotions include: "Gifts Chosen for You", an eight lesson Bible study where you can learn how your daily tasks/jobs are gifts from God. "A Sparrow's Worth", new from Donna Pyle, can be used as an individual devotional journal or by small groups. Two new flip calendars, "God's Grace for Growth" and "Women in the Pew" provide prayers to guide you as you meet life's opportunities and suggest directives for outreach. Both calendars include Bible passages as well as prayers.


Last, but certainly not least, the **2015-2017 reSOURCEs for Planning Programs** provides two years of thematic monthly icebreakers; devotions (all new); 20 new Bible studies; Mission Servant projects; reference to Mission Grants projects; and some new sketches. This resource is available in printed form (\$23.00) or available as a free download (over 200 pages). This is a wonderful, inclusive resource (with lots of ideas) that is both practical and user friendly! Ladies, the time is NOW to discover what your LWML Catalog has to offer you!

The magnets come packaged 200 per case and the case price is \$290 plus \$20 shipping. When you sell the full case you profit about \$690 per case. Marguerite thought this a great fundraiser in getting out a great message to "Keep Christ in Christmas." When getting low on magnets to sell, you can order more.
