Luke 10:2 and He said to them, “The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into His harvest.”



As we continue through this fall season, we know that Advent is fast approaching. Looking toward Advent, we begin asking ourselves this question concerning schedules, decorations, gifts.... We know that for us Lutheran Christians, Advent is the preparation time to re-focus our heart and mind on our Savior's birth and His blood bought gift of redemption. Psalm 40: 1-2 reminds me of the importance of really preparing for the Savior, whose birth, death, resurrection, and ascension we celebrate.

“I waited patiently for the Lord; he turned to me and heard my cry. He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; he set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand. He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see and fear and put their trust in the Lord.”

This verse reminds me of the importance of being in the Word, and the protection, foundation, and refuge we have through the power of the Holy Spirit who enables us to believe that Jesus is our Savior from sin, death, and the devil. That is also the focus of our 2016 LWML RMD Convention, June 10-12, 2016 in Colorado Springs, CO: God – Our Fortress and Refuge! For All the Saints

Death is all around us. It's the most certain thing about our life on earth. Unless Christ returns during our earthly lives, we will most certainly die. "The wages of sin is death," as St. Paul says in Romans 6:23. If there are any lingering doubts about your sinfulness, St. Paul addresses those earlier in the same book: "For all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). Yes, we most certainly will die as a result of our sins.

Although we know that death is approaching, we don't like to talk about it. When we're young, death seems so distant – something that won't affect us until we've reached a ripe old age. But when we're confronted with the death of loved ones, we find ourselves grieving and facing our own mortality. Death was not a part of God's good creation, but entered the world through Adam's sin. This is why death causes such sadness and grief.

As Christians, though, we do not grieve death as those who have no hope. Even though the wages of sin is death, "the free gift of God is eternal life in

Christ Jesus, our Lord" (Romans 6:23). For Christians, our hope in the face of death is that Jesus Christ has overcome sin, death, and the Devil for us, to grant us everlasting life. This is why the mourning of Christian funerals is mellowed by the certain knowledge that in Christ, we will rise again. Death is not the end, but the beginning of everlasting life.

On November 1st, the Church celebrates All Saints Day. This day is set aside to remember those saints of God who have entered their eternal rest. It's a day to celebrate the free gift of eternal life that God has given us through the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ.

But, lo, there breaks a yet more glorious day:

*The saints triumphant rise in bright array;
The King of Glory passes on His way.
Alleluia! Alleluia!*

As we remember those who have died in the faith, give thanks to God that He has won the victory for us!

Use this Advent season to tell those in your family as well as your church family about Jesus' love.



When reading the book of Revelation, we get John's account of God gathering His saints from "all nations". Attendees at the 2015 LWML H2H Conference got a little foretaste of this event when we gathered in Des Moines in June.

Prior to the actual start of the convention a sub-group, called Heart to Heart, assembled to obtain orientation and training to share with the greater assembly and eventually, with our home congregations and communities.

As we beheld one another, we saw sisters representing many districts who hailed from all around the world. There were women from Africa, Asia, Guatemala, Mexico, and many other countries and locales. Our American sisters included Blacks, Latinas, and yes, even Anglos (who experienced firsthand how it felt to be a minority in a group). My roommate was an American citizen who was born in a Japanese internment camp. Yes, we had various backgrounds, but we had one very common bond. We all know that Jesus loves us, died for us, and wants us to share this news with others who haven't realized it yet.

Our group's idea was born back in 2001 when a group of LWML ladies realized we needed to teach one another to relate to the seed of love God planted in the hearts of all His creation. This was being hindered as many of us got stuck on the differences evident in our skin colors and cultures. They decided we needed to relate Heart2Heart, not skin to skin. Doing so with our fellow Lutherans should make it easier to do so in our own communities and day to day lives. They conceived a way to achieve this and then began the forming of a group that materialized a couple of years later.

When this year's convention actually began, our little group of twenty plus got to be presented to our greater group of 4500 plus. We wore various native or cultural dresses, shared various cultural goodies and were open to questions. We sat in awe, as did others, when that magnitude of voices was lifted up in praise to the Almighty God, and we added our mites to others so that His will may better be done in many areas upon the face of the earth.

The next time you encounter a person who is "different" from yourself don't look down or away. Give a smile to them, as you remember they are a part of our God's magnificent creation.
