





I Will Not Leave You As Orphans

As we near the end of this Easter season, our attention is drawn to the promises Jesus made to send the Holy Spirit. The disciples were eye-witnesses of our resurrected Lord, and they rejoiced having Jesus in their midst once again. Yet Jesus' time on earth would be for only a short season. Forty days after His resurrection Jesus ascended into heaven, but He promised that He would not leave them alone. He would send a helper – the Holy Spirit.

Take a look at what Jesus says to His disciples in the Gospel of John:

I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans. John 14:16-18

But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. John 14:26

But when the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness about me. John 15:26

When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you. John 16:13-15

The news that they would be separated from Jesus was troubling. They didn't want things to change. Transitions are not easy, and the disciples would rather have had things stay just the same. However, such changes were for their benefit. Jesus would

not leave them alone. He would send the Holy Spirit.

Our lives are continually changing. We transition to new jobs. We move to new places. Our families change. Our health changes. Our lives are filled with "hellos" and "goodbyes" (and some of those goodbyes are really tough). Some changes are welcome, and we greet them with open arms and excitement. Others are not welcome, and they fill us with fear and trepidation.

In spite of all the changes we see, the promises of God remain constant. In Holy Baptism God has called you. He has made you a member of His Kingdom, and given you His gifts of life, forgiveness and salvation through faith in Christ. He has placed His Spirit in you so that you may believe the things He has spoken in Holy Scripture.

Notice that the work of the Holy Spirit is to guide us into all truth. His task is to glorify Jesus by revealing to us the good news of our salvation through Christ's death and resurrection. Through what means does He do this wonderful work? He does this through God's Holy Word and Sacraments. Through these means the Holy Spirit is continually active in his Church to strengthen and sustain us in the one true faith.

Jesus has not left us as orphans. Through the myriad changes in our lives, God's Word remains constant, and He continues to sustain us as He calls us to repentance and faith in Jesus.

Age to age and soul to soul



2016 LWML RMD Convention Highlights

Friday Night will be Quite ORGANized! - Joel Kremer Theatre Organ

Dave Weesner started attending movies at the Chief Theatre during high school where he was intrigued by the large organ console partially covered in the orchestra pit. During a trip to New York City in 1960, he had experienced the sound of the world's largest Wurlitzer Theatre Pipe Organ in Radio City Music Hall. Having grown up playing piano and organ he was already a theatre organ fan. He studied architecture at CU-Boulder. After college, he started working for a Colorado Springs architect and soon joined a citizen effort to save the historic Chief Theatre from demolition. The effort was unsuccessful, but the group did arrange for the original 1927 Wurlitzer theatre pipe organ to be donated to the City. It is housed at City Auditorium.

Dave met Joel Kremer, who assembled this organ, and helped him move it two times. Upon Joel's death, Dave bought the organ and found a new home for it in Immanuel's gym. It is the largest theatre organ in Colorado --four manual, thirty-six (4/36) rank instrument with over 2500 pipes. The organ also has a full complement of tuned percussions (chimes, xylophone, glockenspiel, sleigh bells, chryso-glott) and traps (drums, cymbals, wood blocks, bird calls, whistles, gong, etc.).



The Little London Winds

The Little London Winds is Colorado Springs' premier Wind Ensemble. The members of the ensemble are volunteers. At 40-plus members strong, the ensemble includes professional and amateur musicians from a wide variety of vocations. Devoted to spreading the love and joy of music and music education in the community, the ensemble spends the spring semester doing joint concerts with area schools. Established in August 1992, the ensemble gathers together serious amateur musicians who enjoy working toward a high standard of performance. The Little London Winds perform a variety of music literature from well-known favorites to newer pieces. The group has performed in concert throughout Southern Colorado and in Raton, New Mexico; they also perform summer evening concerts. The Little London Winds also has a rich history of passing on the love of music and learning by doing clinics and concerts with Colorado Springs area schools. Before Colorado Springs decided to use the "Springs" from Manitou Springs, the city was called "Little London;" the name Little London Winds was chosen based on that history. The performers liked the fact that the name Little London Winds also reflected the wonderful tradition of band music founded by the British.


