## Now Thank We All Our God

Thanksgiving has always been one of my favorite holidays. I like that it is not overcommercialized. I like the emphasis on being thankful for friends, family, food, and all the good things we have in this life. Though many people today have forgotten exactly who it is we should be thanking on this special day, as Christians, we know the One who has given us all good things. *Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights.* (James 1:17) We know the one true God, and so we offer up to Him our praise and thanksgiving.

One thing that has often struck me as odd about our current culture is how Thanksgiving Day, which emphasizes contentment and joy for the abundant blessings we have been given, is followed up by the most frenzied, chaotic shopping day of the year. Just one day after we say, "Wow, I have been given so much," millions of Americans say, "I won't be content until I have more and more and more." Not that it's wrong to go shopping when there is a good sale, but perhaps we should ask the question, "Has the culture's unhealthy obsession with material goods skewed our views of thankfulness?"

As you gather in the Lord's house this Thanksgiving, you very well may sing this familiar hymn:

Now thank we all our God With hearts and hands and voices Who wondrous things has done, In whom His world rejoices; Who from our mothers' arms Has blest us on our way With countless gifts of love And still is ours today. (LSB 895:1) This hymn was written by Pastor Martin Rinckart of Eilenburg, Germany. It was written in the midst of the Thirty Years' War. His town was sacked three times. Armies raged around the town. Refugees flocked to the city, causing famine and disease. It is said that during this time Rinckart would sometimes perform 40 to 50 funerals a day. Even his own wife died from the plague during these years. Yet, in the midst of such suffering, he penned the words, "Now thank we all our God." He intended it as a simple prayer, which he used to thank God for the little amount of food that was available to him.

One might wonder, after so much suffering, how Rinckart could write a hymn of thanks to God. Despite his suffering, he realized what incredible blessings he had been given. He still had God's saving grace through Jesus Christ. No power could ever take that from him. He had enough to support his life. He gave thanks for what he had, instead of being resentful of what he did not have. He also knew that God could use suffering to strengthen His people and make His glory known.

As we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving Day, may we truly take stock of all the blessings that God has given to us. Give thanks to Him for all earthly gifts, but even more important, give thanks to Him for the gift of life and salvation through Jesus Christ.

# The Table at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Lakewood, CO

The Table ministers to the working poor and homeless in the Lakewood area. The volunteers prepare and serve a meal on Thursday evening that is followed by a contemporary worship service and time for Christian fellowship for an average of 85 people a week. Currently, Pastor Ross is focusing on Philippians in his sermon series which leads to more discussion during the fellowship time. This outreach has resulted in one confirmation and one marriage. While the space for the service and the meal is in the Bethlehem Lutheran Church Commons area and most of the volunteers that lead the service, prepare and serve the meal are members of Bethlehem, there is no financial support for food or worship materials. Approximately \$150.00 per week is needed for food which is currently funded by donations of attendees and local donations. As the attendance has increased these funds were becoming insufficient. The volunteers and attendees are very grateful for our support of this mission grant! Please keep The Table in your prayers as you drop your coins in your Mites box.

# Servant Activities for the LWML 2017 Convention

In addition to the school supplies, we are asking for items to provide materials and supplies for the other projects we will be supporting during the Servant Activities. We are also planning to assemble 3,000 personal care kits and tie 150 quilts and 480 fleece blankets for Lutheran World Relief (LWR).

We are asking the Rocky Mountain District to contribute the following items:

#### 68 Untied Quilts

The quilts are to be made according to the specification of LWR *lwr.org/get-involved/quilts*.

LWR quilts should measure approximately 60" x 80". Full-size quilts best serve adults and children as they grow older. Please donate only full-size quilts.

The ultimate purpose of a quilt is to provide warmth, so please choose your fabrics and filler accordingly. Even in warmer climates, temperatures can drop dramatically at night, requiring a quilt with sufficient filler.

Place a piece of fabric measuring 64"x 84" right side down on the table, followed by a filler measuring 60"x 80", and then another piece of fabric, also measuring 60"x 80", right side up on top of the filler. Pin the layers in place.

Bring the edges of the 64"x 84" piece over the top, pin, and machinestitch the edge, using a zigzag stitch if possible.

Since the quilts are being tied at the convention, as a part of the Servant Activities, you may want to leave the pins in place, so all the layers stay together for tying.

#### 563 Backpacks

The backpacks will be used to distribute the school supplies we have been collecting for LWR and

the Navajo Mission in New Mexico. The pattern for the backpack can be found on our website, *lwmlrmd.org* and also a copy was given to your zone president at the fall rally.

#### 1,350 Towels

The dark colored bath-size towels will be used as part of the personal care kits.

This could be a servant project for your society to collect or make during the holidays. How can you finance these projects? Thrivent Choice dollars can help. If you have a Thrivent account, you can go online and request funds. Items collected can be sent with your zone president when they attend the February 2017 Board of Directors.

Deadline to receive these items is April 15, 2017.

# Favors for the 2017 National Convention

Does your LWML group crochet or knit? Or are there members who are interested in learning? What a wonderful way to connect with each other!

Volunteers are needed to crochet or knit dishcloths and "scrubbies" as favors for the convention delegates. Your LWML group gets to decide on your design which will be created in colors of purple, lilac, or combination with white.

If crocheting and knitting is not your forte, maybe you are a sewing machine embroiderer extraordinaire. Volunteers are also needed to embroider, on a sewing machine, "LWML" in ½-inch white block letters, on already purchased purple banadanas.



## 2017 Convention Banner Design

It's time once again for banner designs! Do you have a creative flair for design or a passion to draw?

The 37<sup>th</sup> biennial convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League is already in the planning stages. We are seeking a special design for our district banner. This banner will be carried by our president, Sylvia Bean, during the opening ceremonies of the Albuquerque, New Mexico convention, June 22-25, 2017.

#### Theme: "Jesus Christ Above All"

Scripture Reference: Therefore God has highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name. (Philippians 2:9)

#### **Goal Statement:**

Empowered by the Holy Spirit, through Word and Sacrament, I will proclaim Jesus Christ above all. Convention Objectives:

Each convention attendee will be:

- Encouraged through worship and Bible study.
- Equipped to share His message of salvation.
- Engaged in celebrating God's faithfulness while serving the Lord with gladness.

#### **Banner Designs Guidelines**

- a) Illustrate the design on an 8 1/2" x 11" sheet of unlined paper or graph paper of similar size;
- b) Submit the design in full color;
- c) Include an explanation of how the banner design depicts the theme of the LWML convention;
- d) Include the name, address, and phone number of the designer and the name of the society and church;
- e) Advise as to whether the designer or the society is willing to make the banner. If not, the LWML RMD Executive Committee will select someone to make the banner;
- f) The district will pay for the cost of the materials, if requested;
- g) At the February 2017 meeting of the LWML RMD Board of Directors, the design to be used will be selected;
- h) By February 1, 2017, please send your design and other required information to the vP of Communications: Lesley Nordmeyer, 551 Shoshone St., Grand Junction, co 81504 (email: *lnordmeyer@q.com*)

#### **Completed Banner Specifications**

- a) Finished banner size is to be 3'x 5' and will be carried lengthwise. If you add fringe, it may be longer;
- b) Use of the convention logo is NOT permitted, but the design must be based on the convention theme "Jesus Christ Above All";
- c) The banner may be any color;
- d) The name, ROCKY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT, must be on the front of the banner. The name may be abbreviated, and any size letters may be used. To help identify our district's banner when rolled up, a small identifying tag naming our district will be placed on the lower left hand corner of the back side of the banner;
- e) The banner should be attached to a 1" dowel stick with an eye screw on each end, laying the cord flat along the rod and knotting it on the outside of each screw eye. The cord (heavy enough to support the weight of the banner) will stretch when the banner is hung. A set of ties is to be sewn on the back of the banner, 12" from the top and another set of ties 12" from the bottom to secure the banner to the pole. A pole and stand for the banner will be provided at the convention site by the host committee.
