We're now officially in the fall of the year. Now is the time when we get ready for cooler temperatures and weather. We're also beginning those preparations for Thanksgiving and Christmas. The End is Near! Closing out the Church Year

The end is near! Before you start thinking that I'm spouting off about some looney end of the world prediction, allow me to explain.

We are nearing the end of the the church year. The month of November brings us to the final Sundays in the Church year's calendar. This year the last Sunday in the Church year is November 26, and the new year begins with the first Sunday of Advent on December 3. Pay close attention to the Scripture readings as you gather in worship over the next few weeks. If your congregation uses either the one year or three year lectionary series, you will notice a theme on the end times, the return of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the final judgement. This is an appropriate way to close out the church year. You will also notice that this theme is a part of Advent as we begin the new year.

Talking about the end times is tricky business. A lot of people are very fascinated by the subject, and there are a lot of people who enthusiastically teach on the topic, but so much of what is taught is not grounded in what Scripture actually teaches about our Lord's return. In fact, much of it is quite dangerous and destructive.

Much of what we hear in our day comes from teachings that greatly distorts God's Word. Concepts like the rapture and a secret return of Christ, though popular among many preachers, are not found in Scripture. Much of what we hear tries to interpret current events and make them fit with the Bible's teaching, but this only leads to confusion and fear. Did you hear of the latest prediction that the world was going to end on September 23, 2017? Didn't happen! That's no surprise. It's always good to remember what Jesus taught. No one knows the day or the hour of His return (See Matthew 24:36).

Certainly there are times when we look at the things going on in this world and wonder how long until our Lord returns. The devil works hard to sow doubt in our minds so that we will forget Christ's promise to return. 2 Peter 3:9 tells us *The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not*

the judgement, for though our sin is great, and we deserve only death, we have one who has conquered sin and the grave for us. Therefore it is with great hope that the church prays "Come, Lord Jesus!" 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 declares this hope saying, But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. For this we declare to you by a word from the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

wishing that any should perish, but

that all should reach repentance.

When our Lord teaches about

Christ's return, it is a great comfort

for the Christian. We need not fear

The news of our Lord's return is a teaching with which we are to encourage one another. I pray that as you think upon this theme in the coming weeks you will be encouraged in the certainty of God's promise to gather His dearly beloved children to Himself when He returns. What a glorious day that will be.

Operation Barnabas for Comfort Care Congregations

This grant helps fund a new partnership between Operation Barnabas and the Comfort Dog Program to address the needs of veterans and their families. Operation Barnabas is an outreach of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod's Ministry to the Armed Forces. The ministry is named after Barnabas, Paul's missionary companion and aide. His name literally means "son of encouragement." Providing encouragement is a key component in their ministry to military members, veterans and their families.

One of their goals is to serve as a resource to other organizations that provide care to military families and veterans. Equipping

churches to reach out to veterans with the love of Christ. The transition between military and civilian life is a period of critical adjustment. In addition, thousands of troops are struggling with PTSD. Comfort Dogs are often able to calm individuals and help facilitate conversation. Because of the success of the Comfort Dogs in touching veterans lives, Comfort Dog Congregations are encouraged to join the Operation Barnabas network of care.

The first training session for "Operation Barnabas for Comfort Dog Congregations" took place at First Good Shepherd Lutheran

Beth Nagy VP Christian Life As I was thinking about what to write for this issue of the *Tidings*, a short devotion I read blessed me, so I decided to share it with you. It is from a small devotional book entitled *Be Blessed* written by Jane L. Fryar. *The Lord said to Moses*... *"This is how you*

are to bless the Israelites." Numbers 6:22–23

Imagine a camping trip—a camping trip lasting forty years! To those of us who have grown fond of our society's creature comforts, life in a tent for four decades seems, well, challenging!

The Old Testament details events of the forty years ancient Israel spent camping in the desert learning to know, love and trust God. But despite the hardships, a bright thread of hope winds its way through each account. Everywhere we look, we see assurances that God loves His people with a fierce and committed love.

As if to underscore that hope, Numbers 6

includes an explicit expression of blessing commonly referred to as the Aaronic benediction....*The Lord bless you and keep you* (v. 24).

"Be blessed!" God says through Moses and Aaron....The covenant-making God who led Israel through deserts and oases also leads us through the spiritually dry and spiritually lush times in our lives.
