The Word Made Flesh?

The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. John 1:14

The Word

Yes, I put a question mark at the end of the title of this article. Though not because the reality of it is in doubt. Not doubting the certainty of it. But because of the wonderful divine mystery of it! That word 'mystery' may bring memories of Agatha Christie and her 60+ detective novels. But when we consider Jesus a mysterious gift, one needs to forget about those CSI images. As useful as detective-like reasoning can be, it is of no use to us when it comes to the mystery of the God-man, the Word made flesh.

Jesus of Nazareth, born in Bethlehem is an historical fact. The Romans didn't deny he existed. Neither do the Jewish fathers. The historical writings do not discount Jesus as a walking, talking, living, breathing human being. My wife, Joline and I had the privilege of walking some of the paths that Jesus, without question, walked Himself.

Even so, every attempt to rationally or scientifically explain how Iesus is both God and man in one person ends in disaster to individual faith and Christianity as a religion. (That is after all, one reason why Jesus was crucified. The Sanhedrin couldn't rationalize this Jesus as God in the flesh.) The Word of God, in fact, doesn't try to rationally explain how Jesus can be fully God and fully man at the same time. It factually states that He is. It is through the Word, that we come to believe this truth and rejoice in what it means for each of us.

In this Word made flesh, we have the powerful voice of God Himself that created the universe and all it contains. In this Word made flesh, we have the powerful voice of God that made Mt. Sinai AND Israel quake at His presence. In this Word made flesh, we have the powerful voice of God Himself now cloaked by human words and language; first a baby's cooing, then a child teaching in the synagogue, and later the preaching of a rabbi, and then a dying prayer from a cross.

In this Word made flesh, we have the fulfillment of the priestly office, perfect in every way, and so He was qualified to enter

> the Most Holy Place of God to cover the sins of His people not with the blood of sheep and goats, but with His own holy and precious blood and His innocent suffering and death. As a true man, He was under the law just like all of us. And as true God, His redemption was applied to all of us. God assuming human flesh to redeem us!


In Jesus, the perfect solution to man's debt to God is found. A solution that allows God to be just.....and loving at the same

time. Jesus was born for that one purpose, born under the law to redeem those under the law. Here is one man, who is also God, so that His redemption would restore all His

24,000 meals a day; 4,000,000 meals per school year—that's a lot of rice and beans! The Trinity HOPE Haitian Feeding Program has served over 30,000,000 meals since 1993. 30 million! And while the students, teachers, and cooks of over 118 Christian schools in Haiti are served physically through these meals, they are also fed spiritually through the gospel message of Jesus' love and salvation.

As the people of Haiti are faced with poverty, natural disasters, and the influences of Voodoo, it is our joy to share in the ministry to these children and their families. Our partially funded mission grant of \$5,000 helps provide meals (at \$0.25 each!) to schools such as First Lutheran of Les

Cayes, Haiti. When the children hear about God's love for them, they bring that Good News home to family and friends. Jesus'

2018 Mission Walk



A. Enrichment Session Speaker: Mr. Gary Thies

Session Title: Who Are the Real Missionaries?...It's Time to Wake Up and Be Not Normal

This presentation will contain some very, very NOT NORMAL pictures, reflecting the fact that we are mostly asleep...on

Sunday morning and also during the week! There is a "DUMBING DOWN" going on in this country and people are being told, "This is a free country and you can attend any church you want on Sunday morning, BUT DON'T YOU BE TELLING ANYONE ABOUT IT, BECAUSE YOU COULD OFFEND THEM!" We are now being "overwhelmed" in this country and in our churches with being "politically correct."

Saturday Night Keynote address: "WHAT ARE YOU DOING HERE?" A message about taking Jesus personally, and a message of why the churches are decreasing in numbers! Why are you sitting here tonight? What really is going on in the "church" today and what is the "church" really all about? What do the words of John 20:21 really mean?

Gary Thies is a member of St. Matthew Lutheran Church, Mapleton, IA, where he has served as a congregational president, director of education, and has served for 35 years as a Bible class teacher.

From 1983–1994, he served as chairman on the LCMS Board for Mission Services.

Traveling to more than 75 foreign countries and mission fields, Gary has presented mission programs and travel lecture programs in more than 1250 cities. He's the founder and licensed real estate broker for Trust Realty of Mapleton, IA, and a licensed insurance agent for Pike Insurance Agency of Mapleton, IA. He's the Founder and Director of Mission Central established in 2003 as largest LCMS Mission Support Agency. Gary has spoken in more than 1700 congregations in the United States and Canada and has worked with 8000 individual families and 1100 individual congregations promoting Mission Central's goal of mission education and the awareness of the mission of Jesus Christ in the world; last year 118 furloughing missionaries and their family members stayed at Mission Central. In 2011 Gary received the "Christus Vivit Award" from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, and in 2012 was awarded "Doctor of Humane Letters" from Concordia University St. Paul, MN.



2018 District Convention

Baby Quilt/Blanket for 2018 Zone Banners

The RMD Executive Committee is once again asking each zone to make a baby quilt/ blanket to be used as your zone banner that will be donated as part of "Gifts of the Heart" following the convention.

Suggested Size: 36" by 40"

Fabric Suggestion: Cotton Fleece, Soft Denim, Knit, Calico

DETAILS:

- The baby quilt/blanket will be carried in the opening procession by the president, young woman representatives, and the teen representative from each zone.
- Zone names will be printed on a sign and handed out during processional practice and carried in by one of the zone representatives. Please have a card attached to the back of the banner on the lower right hand side with the zone name and the person/church/group that made the banner.
- The quilt/blanket should include a casing on the back (that will fit a 1" dowel), a 1" dowel stick with an eye screw on each end, and a cord that can be tied to each eye screw with extra cord to hang from the knot. Lay the cord flat along the rod and knot it on the outside of each screw eye. The cord (heavy enough to support the weight of the banner) will stretch when the banner is hung.
- Each zone is to provide a banner pole and stand. Each zone will be assigned a spot for their banner.
- Zone Banners will be displayed in the assigned banner area throughout the convention.
- Zones are welcome and encouraged to make more than quilt/blanket;
 however, only one quilt/blanket will be used in the opening procession.
- Quilt/blanket designs may be based on the convention logo, but is not required. Any theme, design, or color is acceptable.
- Talk to your zone president to submit an idea for your quilt/ blanket banner design. Let's put these banners to work as we "boldly" share Jesus' love with others based on our theme verse:

Who from your zone is designing the banner for your zone president to carry in the processional? That can be one of your quilts for a Layette Kit!


