Attend the LWML convention in Mobile, Ala. It doesn't matter where we gather or how many obstacles we need to overcome to get there (or back), gathering together as Lutheran Women in Mission is life changing.

What makes it so special? When I gather with over 3000 mission minded women, pastors, youth and husbands, I am reminded of the scope of the LWML mission. We sang praises to the Lord, received Holy Communion and engaged in Bible study. We were fed in so many ways over the few days we were in Mobile.

We were encouraged and inspired by Mites in Action Speakers. Each Mission in Action speaker spoke so eloquently about their mission that I was moved to tears frequently they shared their stories. It is amazing to hear how God is working in our world. The LWML is making an eternal difference in the world through the prayers and generous gifts of each one of you. I saw such an outpouring of love through the offerings, gifts of love donations, and Mission in Motion Pledge Walk participation.

Many women participated in servant events and Pre-convention Seminars on Thursday. The Rocky Mountain District was well represented. Many of the volunteers from the Albuquerque convention decided to attend this convention to see what they only glimpsed while working so diligently in 2017. They had VIP seating that allowed them to see and hear everything going on. I saw many of their smiling faces. We had at least five first time attendees including two of our delegates. Many of our frequent convention attendees including Ruth Eberle from Artesia, N.M. were also in Mobile. Ruth has attended at least 16 national conventions. wow!!

I was honored to carry our Rocky Mountain District banner in the banner procession on Friday morning. The banner was very unique and beautiful. Thank you to Sue Giddings and Anita Palenschat for creating it. Our YWRS, Julie Tibbetts and Christina Bean, and our Heart to Heart Sister Leader Diane Rahe also participated in the banner procession. On Saturday, 81 YWRs and 12 H2H Sister Leaders led the Saturday morning procession which highlighted 76 flags representing countries where the LWML has supported a mission grant.

Evening entertainment from sand artist Joe Castillo and the Voices of Mobile were a wonderful way to end busy days.

A mission goal of \$2,100,000 for the 2019–2020 biennium will fund 21 LWML Mission Grants including a grant from Ysleta Lutheran Mission in El Paso, Texas.

Debbie Larson was elected President. Debbie moved to the Rocky Mountain District two years ago and resides in Florissant, Colo. I look forward to working with Debbie. Please continue to support her with your prayers as she begins her work as LWML President.

Past RMD President Sylvia Bean was selected as a member of the Nominating Committee. Please keep her in your prayers.

The Voice

I and the Father are One. John 10:30

Many of you reading this article have just returned from the LWML 38th Biennial Convention held in Mobile, Ala. under the theme "In Praise to the Lord!". The theme verse was, *Sing to the Lord, all the earth! Tell of his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations* (1 Chronicles 16:23–24a).

Tomorrow morning, if you went to the Post Office and heard the voice of someone on the corner boasting, "I and the Father are one", how would you react? You might walk away. You might get back into your car or start walking all to come back later. You might even call 911! Well, neither did the Jews believe that Jesus was true God as He claimed by saying, I and the Father are one. The very next verses in John 11 record that they even picked up stones to hurl at Him for such blasphemy. A mere man, claiming to be God. Blasphemy!

What if those people were right? If Jesus is not God, then at best he was only a PHD in Old Testament literature. A famous character two thousand years ago that appeared for thirty years in human history. Jesus was merely a blip on the radar. At worst, Jesus was and continues to be, the world's greatest con-man. Either way, Jesus would be no Savior, which would leave every Christian believer in hopeless despair. You would have no Savior from your sins because His death meant nothing. There were no Easter resurrection witnesses. He provides no victory over death. Faith in Him is in vain and useless. You and I are still in our sins and death is terminal.

In all sincerity and without misusing the Lord's name, thank God they were wrong! Jesus is true God. When He told the Jews, *I and the Father are ONE*, He was claiming to be God in the very same way that God the Father is God. Jesus is the confession of the Old Testament faithful, *Hear*, *O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one* (Deut. 6:4).

Jesus has the same divine nature that the Father and the Holy Spirit have. Jesus proved that by rising from the dead on Easter morning just as He promised and just as countless people witnessed! And that means that every other promise is also true.

But at the same time, Jesus is not the Father. Jesus also makes that distinction when He says that "I and the Father are one." Jesus is of one nature with the Father, but He is also distinct from the Father. The Father sent Him, the Son, into the world of His creating to be the Savior of His creation.

Since Jesus is true God, He has the power, the ability, and the nature, to accomplish everything the Father sent Him to do. His perfect life, innocent suffering and death, and His victorious resurrection in deed and in fact, accomplished your salvation. Jesus is then your connection to God the Father. And through Jesus, you have access to the Father in every need of yours.

That's what I think of when I see or hear of the television program, "The Voice". Jesus is THE VOICE of God Himself. He came to share a human nature with His creation, to be on our side, to be our Savior, that no one could separate us from Him.

The Lord has also given YOU a voice. To "Praise the Lord", to "Sing to the Lord", to "Tell of His salvation", and to "Declare His glory among the nations". And that, in whatever station He has placed you or in whatever vocation He has given you. ≸

Sierra Leone Mission Grant

Project Pastoral Education, West Africa (PPEWA) offers ongoing pastoral education courses and support provided by the Concordia Institute for Christian Studies to the pastors of Lutheran Churches in countries throughout West Africa: Sierra Leone, Liberia, The Gambia, and Ghana. Since 2007, in Sierra Leone, PPEWA has been assisting pastors to become better leaders in their churches in the midst of a great pastoral shortage (16 ordained pastors for 159 congregations). Now they are assisting the Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church in establishing a seminary in Sierra Leone. In 2018 they have made

great strides in this effort, including beginning construction of a library and classroom for the seminary, conducting 3 training sessions to equip 10 future seminary faculty members, and adopting a strategic plan for the new seminary. God willing, they will begin instruction of the first seminary class in 2019. The \$10,000 grant will cover some travel and lodging expenses for the three LCMS pastoral instructors (2 of whom are from the Rocky Mountain District) who volunteer for two weeks to provide advanced theological education to these men, helping to impact the spread of the Gospel in West Africa. 🖋
