Theme Verses

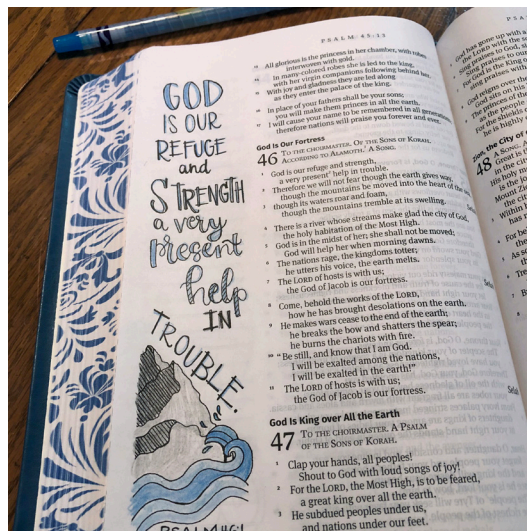
Happy New Year 2020—A new year, a new decade.

Lutherans for Life Post-Abortion Hotline

As we reflect on the Sanctity of Life this January, the Word of Hope post-abortion hotline is ministering to many burdened by an abortion decision. Deaconess Chrissie Gillet, PsyD, an experienced counselor, was hired in 2018 as the Lutherans for Life Word of Hope Director. She replaced longtime volunteer director Grace Kern, who recently retired. Deaconess Chrissie crisscrossed many states this past summer and fall, speaking at various LCMS events and churches to inform people about life issues and the Word of Hope hotline. She was one of the exhibitors at our LWML Convention in Mobile. Maybe you were one of the 200+ people that received educational and promotional material at the Lutherans of Life booth.

Due to the generosity of grants from organizations like LWML and donations from supporters, goals to expand the hotline are being accomplished. Word of Hope has increased staff hours, acquired advanced software, revised media and developed an informational packet that is being distributed nationally. The national publicity plus updated software improved hotline awareness and efficiency resulted in monthly contacts (phone, email, text and video calls) multiplying more than 7 times from 2018 to 2019.

Deaconess Chrissie shares that it is difficult to assess or share the impact on those who contact the hotline due to confidentiality and the inability to measure work by the

God Always Has a Plan

“We just finished our children’s Christmas program at church. I was laughing at the pictures of Mary and Joseph with the other moms — talking about how scared and confused they looked. Then it hit me. That’s probably how Mary and Joseph really were. Imagine, having to tell your parents you were pregnant before you were married, then having to tell your fiancé. Both make my stomach clench. If they believed you, would everyone else? Mary didn’t care, and even sang praises in her Magnificat at the end of Luke Chapter 1. Her faith is amazing, especially considering scholars think she might have only been fourteen. She believed wholeheartedly that God would take care of her, just as in Jeremiah 29:11 where the prophet says: *I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to*



harm you, plans to give you hope and future.

Then there’s Joseph. In Donna Pyle’s Bible Study *Forgiveness*, she points out that the betrayal of adultery is one of the hardest and deepest wounds to overcome. Even though the child Mary was carrying was of the Holy Spirit, what faith Joseph had to build a family, raise a child that wasn’t his, then have other children with Mary. In Matthew 1:18–25 an angel visits Joseph and explains what is going on, and Joseph accepts Jesus as his son. But still, you can’t help but wonder if he felt a little left out in the whole “Messiah Plan” that was going on around him.

When it seems the “plan” is going on without us, trust in the Lord and His plan. Be thankful that you can be one of the witnesses to His glorious works. 🌿

Holy Spirit. Some of the comments frequently made are “I am shocked,” “wondering if I can live this way,” and “I don’t know what to do.” After connecting with Word of Hope these statements change to, “I wanted to thank you again for speaking to me about my abortion. For the first time in a long time I am beginning to feel that peace is a possibility” and “I’m so relieved...Love you.”

2020 Convention Ingathering News

Three ministries will be recipients of our 2020 ingathering: Lutheran Indian Ministries/Navajo Ministry (lutheranindianministries.org/navajoministry); Lutheran Valley Retreat (lvr.org); and Ysleta Lutheran Mission/Human Care (ylm.org).

Convention ingathering usually has a hand-on approach, like making a quilt, gathering things to make a layette, or buying items to send in a care package to the military. Not this convention! This convention's ingathering is gift cards. Can you get on board with donating gift cards? You won't be cutting squares and sewing them together to make cuddly baby quilts, but it's still a great ingathering.

Can you get on board to buy gift cards for Ysleta Lutheran Mission/Human Care so they can go to Walmart or Sam's Club to buy what they need for their Hot Lunch Program? Can you get on board to buy gift cards for the Lutheran Indian Ministries/Navajo Mission so they can buy diapers for a baby whose mother can't afford them or paper plates for their Sunday, after the service meal? Can you get onboard to buy gift cards for Lutheran Valley Retreat, so they can buy plumbing supplies to fix their kitchen or a bathroom?

When you come to the convention at Keystone, there is no need to fill your car's trunk with ingathering items. You can put many, many gift cards in an envelope! Here are some notes to help you decide what gift cards to buy.

- Gift cards of any donation are welcome. Five and ten dollar gift cards can be given to a person needing help and larger gift cards can be used by the mission to buy their needed items.
- There will be containers for each mission, plus a container for a combined donation that

will be divided evenly between the three missions.

- Costco, Home Depot and Lowes are also good places to buy gift cards, or buy nonspecific gift cards, e.g. Visa cards. (Navajo Mission doesn't have a Costco near.)
- Please write the amount of the gift on the

card. It helps with counting.

Can you get onboard with gift cards? Yes you can! Start Now! Every time you are in Walmart, or Sam's Club add a \$10-\$20 gift card to your shopping list, then store them under your Mite Box. See how many cards you can accumulate by convention. 🌿
