God Cares About You

God Cares About You is a ministry that had its start in 2009 when nine Lutheran Congregations in Albuquerque, New Mexico decided to begin a ministry in the International Zone of Albuquerque. Initially the ministry served meals, offered job counseling, and offered worship services. Food, clothing, school supplies and sharing Jesus are also a big part of the program. Our grant specifically provides a weekend bag of food for each child to take home at the end of the Saturday session of Sunday School/ Vacation Bible School program, which serves ten to thirty children. During the week, the children may be eating at school or at the mission, but on the weekend they may not have food in the home. The food that is provided does not need refrigeration or cooking since many of the children are living in challenging, sometimes unsupervised, households where they take care of themselves.

The grant is for \$8,000 which is to be distributed over a two-year period.

The Children's Weekend Food Bag offers the child the assurance that God cares about them through the caring of others. The child may have few caring people who have few resources to share with him or her. Each child may have memories of bad treatment so learning to trust others for care is another benefit of the food bag. Learning to trust in God who will be with them and watch over them is important. We pray that the children and other family members will come to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

Lord, We pray for the volunteers who will prepare the bags and distribute them to the children. We pray for the children who will receive the weekly bag of food, that it may nourish their bodies and spirits. We pray that through this special ministry many children and their families may know their Lord and Savior Jesus. We ask this in the name of Jesus who cares for us and has redeemed us. Amen

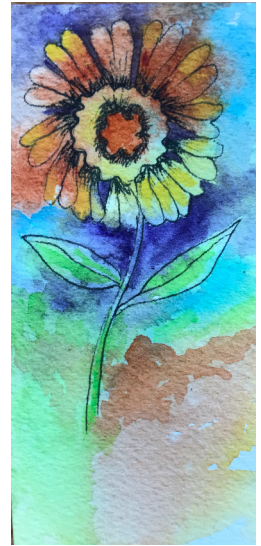

The banner will be processed during the opening ceremonies of the 39th biennial convention of the LWML in Lexington, Kentucky and displayed in the convention hall.

Any LCMS woman in the Rocky Mountain District may submit a banner design. The finished banner size is to be 3 ft by 5 ft. Please keep in mind these specifications when submitting your design. You may NOT use the 2021 convention logo in your design. You may use the logo

colors or other colors of your choosing. If you would like the specifications for the blue and green in the convention logo, please contact the Communications VP or check out the information on the district website.

The district’s name will be on the front and it could be abbreviated, such as RMD. Remembering that this banner will be carried by President Debbie Yocky, please consider leaving out bulky or heavy fabrics/objects from the design. The banner design and banner construction do not need to be completed by the same person.

Submit a scaled, full-color design to the Communications VP (either by email or mail) no later than January 15, 2021. Include with the design, a description and how it depicts the verse/theme of the convention, your name, and the name of your congregation. The Board of Directors will decide the banner design at their 2021 meeting in February.

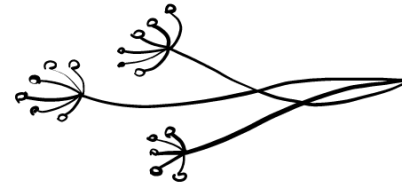

Worship Comes from the Heart



Psalm 95:6-7: Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker; for he is our God and we are the people of his pasture, the flock under his care.

By the time that this issue of Tidings has been published, our first “virtual” Bible study of the LWML RMD, hosted by the Christian Life committee, will have completed three of the four lessons included in the study. This study from Donna (Pyle) Snow, *Facedown Worship* is based upon Psalm 95:6-7. Joined by many LWML sisters in Christ, via Zoom, we have stayed in the Word “virtually,” despite our inability to join physically to worship Him during this time of COVID19. God invites us, and in some instances commands us, to worship Him in spirit and in truth. I am grateful that despite the challenges we face, God always seems to keep His Word accessible to us. I am thankful for those capable women of the LWML RMD that have shared their skills, experience, and gifts to make this virtual Bible study possible... complete with hymns, music, videos, chat rooms, group discussion, prayer and most importantly, as a demonstration of their love for Christ.

So what have been the highlights of our Bible study so far? We have learned that worship is not always easy. We struggle looking for the right words in prayer. We sometimes bumble Scripture. We don't always know when to kneel, or when to stand. We have found, however, that a lot of these questions make little difference in authentic worship if we don't have a heart hungry for God. Worship encompasses the intentional attitudes and actions of focusing on God. If the “how” we worship, or the method, becomes more important than the “who” we

worship, we are missing the whole point of worship!

Did you know that every person is born with a need or desire to worship? Worship is not something that can be taught or developed, but it is created within us. Genuine worship overflows from a mind renewed by the truth of God. Genuine worship is mostly about surrendering and giving up control to our Lord and Savior. Worshipping God in spirit and in truth is all about Him. Worship is for Him only. Mark 12:30 tells us: *And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength.*

Prayer is pointed out in the Study as being a vital part of our Christian walk. God imparts His guidance, peace, comfort and instruction to us in intimate prayer and worship. Oswald Chambers is quoted as saying, “When I worship, I would rather my heart be without words than my words be without heart.” Our hearts need to be moved and impressed by God in both prayer and worship.

When we study God's Word, we come to know more and more that He is our God. There is no one else worthy of our praise and worship. The Bible isn't about the desire of people to be with God; it's the desire of God to be with people. God first loved us. His love is everlasting. How do we respond to a love so great? We, in return, love and serve others in His name.

I would like to thank you who have joined us in the study of God's Word through this first virtual Bible study of the LWML RMD.

“If I plan my estate or end of life decisions, it means that I accept that I will die, and I don’t want to talk about such things.”

That was Susan’s response to a Gift Planning Counselor of the LCMS Foundation. That counselor pointed her to the words of Jesus in John 11 when He said, “*I am the resurrection and life...whoever lives and believes in me will by no means die, forever.*” Their conversation centered around the truth that because of Jesus and His death and resurrection, “*death no longer has mastery over [us].*” (Romans 6:9b NIV)

Whether here on earth or with the Lord in heaven, life continues. *For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling, because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked. For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened,*

because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. (2 Corinthians 5:1–4 NIV)

Having this conversation gave Susan a sense of peace. She put her Lifetime Plan for Giving™ together with her Gift Planning Counselor. She was thankful that this process had finally enabled her to get beyond the fear of death and dying that had haunted her throughout her life.

Pray for the Holy Spirit to work in the heart of your friend. Pray for the Holy Spirit to bless all interactions with your friends and family.

BE CREATIVE:

Exchange stories of family Christmas traditions. You’ll learn about others’ current spiritual situation and be able to share what Jesus means to you. Invite your friends to make new traditions this year, especially if the Christmas season is stressful or depressing. Invite them to read the devotions with you, go to Advent services, or participate in a servant event. Bring

your friend or family member to help work at a church activity before Christmas. Getting to know people in a non-threatening way makes them more likely to attend future worship.

FOLLOW UP:

Devotions from Lutheran Hour Ministries can help keep your faith conversations going. Read, listen, e-mail, or print at lhm.org/advent.

What better news is there than to know that God is always by our side! In *God with Us*, we learn again what God the Father has done— He has kept His promise. In so doing, He has announced that grace and forgiveness are available to all, a gift made possible by the birth of Jesus: God’s Son, our Savior. He is Immanuel, “God with us.”
