


KEEP YOUR EYES ON JESUS

REMEMBERING GOD'S PERFECT GIFTS FROM ABOVE

What a wonderful District convention we had. As we remember all the great moments that went on during the LWML Rocky Mountain District 51st Biennial Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, we smile and enjoy the memories. We also know that the convention gives us goals to accomplish for the Lord. The convention theme was "Perfect Gifts from Above," from the Bible Verse James 1: 17. During the convention I talked about verse 17 in three related Bible Studies. In this devotional I would like to talk to you about the first part of James 1.

James, the brother of Jesus, is writing to all those who have had to flee from Jerusalem because the Romans came to the Jerusalem area and destroyed and killed all those who tried to defend Jerusalem. These Christians were facing trials and problems that most of us have never experienced unless you have been suddenly forced to leave your home and livelihood because of war or persecution.

James says to his fellow Christians dealing with these horrible situations, Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. (James 1:2–4)

Count it all joy. How do you do that when you are forced to move, forced to restart your life, forced to live in a place and among people that are unfamiliar to you? You can't unless

you are basing your life on your faith in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. That's right, the only way you can face any of the trials of life is with the sure and certain hope in God; who is in control of our lives through our Heavenly Father; who has saved us from the worst enemy by sending His only Son into this world to live that perfect life in God's love. He gave it to us by His Life, Death, and Resurrection. He also sent the Holy Spirit to be in our lives through His Word and Sacraments to bring us to faith, keep us in Faith and strengthen us in that Faith through God's Sacraments.

That's right, the greatest of all the Perfect Gifts from Above is our faith and trust in God as our Creator. Redeemer and Sanctifier. So, what are the problems that you are dealing with this summer? My guess is that they are not as bad as those being dealt with by the Christians of the first Century and this is what God says to us and them through James the brother of Jesus, If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him. But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. (James 1:5–6)

Now here's where I have to admit that I am definitely lacking in faith and often doubt. Then I find myself being driven and tossed by the winds of the world instead of standing on the solid





AN OUTPOURING OF PERFECT GIFTS

Ladies, you certainly gave the Mission Servants Committee a challenge sorting, counting, and packing the mountain of perfect Gifts from the Heart that poured into the Albuquerque convention! Fortunately, the YWRs and Teen Reps along with Jill Clark's daughter-in-law, Erica helped us tackle the pile. A report was ready in time for the dedication of our Perfect Gifts on Saturday.



The next challenge was transporting and delivering the donations to the three ministry recipients. Christina and Sylvia Bean delivered the 272 boxes of feminine hygiene products and 488 pairs of new underwear plus 31 bras and 26 pairs of socks to the Hartley House, a shelter for battered women in Clovis, NM. Germán Montiel, director of God Cares About You and Al Koschmann, GCAY Board Member made several trips picking up the 898 hygiene kits and 632 Children's Bible Story books donated to their ministry to the homeless and disadvantaged in Albuquerque's International Zone. (See the photo with the boxes of kits and books received at GCAY.) Several vehicles were packed with 601 new toys and 219 blankets (which included the 86 Servant Event blankets) bound for Ysleta Lutheran Mission's outreach on both sides of the border. I breathed a sigh of relief when the final bag of blankets was stuffed into the last car returning to El Paso! Many struggling people will be blessed by this outpouring of love. Pray that the Light of Jesus will shine through these Perfect Gifts.




COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS AND STONE SOUP

Bud had always taken care of the financial matters: paying bills, investing, and planning for the future. They had been married for seventy years. Now, Marie was feeling overwhelmed. The financial planner kept calling, asking her permission to change investment strategies. The life insurance company regularly had calling teams contacting her, asking if she wanted to add to her coverage. The local bank kept sending mail asking her if she wanted to refinance the mortgage. The senior living representative she and Bud had met four years ago kept asking if she was ready to move into assisted living. The burden of these decisions was overwhelming. So, when her daughter asked her if she had reviewed her will lately, Marie became angry. "I just need everyone to leave me alone. Stop bugging me."

It is wise to do good planning while both spouses are alive. It is even better to make sure that those plans are written down, detailing an organized, planned approach to caring for the financial gifts God has placed in your care. It is unwise to expect that children or other relatives will be able to jump in, without any prior involvement, to make the same kind of choices you have chosen all your life. They will lovingly do their part, but you may be asking them to carry out a difficult or impossible task. Planning can bring peace of mind. When a good plan is in place, seeking interaction with professional legal, financial or tax advisors can be seen as continuing that plan. Asking children to help will also be part of that continuance.

Now is a good day to start. Your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can highlight areas of decision and point you to the right professionals to help you write down a plan, all the while expressing your love for your family and your devotion to the Lord. Contact Carol vonSoosten at:


