THE ADVENT AND THE FINAL ADVENT OF OUR LORD AND SAVIOR

As we move into the months of November and December we move into the months looking forward to something far greater than what we have today. Though we don't usually call the month of November a time of advent, it is because throughout the month of November our scripture readings lead us to look for the coming of the Last Day, both in our lives and in the advent of our new heavenly home. November often prepares us for Thanksgiving and giving thanks to God for all that He has given to us, yet our scripture readings for the month of November prepare us for the Advent of the last day of this world and the heavenly home we have been promised.

So with the coming of the end of November and the start of December we celebrate the Advent Season of the Church Year. Advent, the season of the coming of our Lord.

As usual though, the first Sunday of Advent brings us back to the advent of the Last Day, which is the reason why we need the Christ child to come to be one of us in this world. Jesus comes into this world to make us guiltless, which means He leads a perfect life, which we are unable to do, so that He can take all our sins upon Himself and make the full and final payment for them. His Advent enables us to be in heaven when the last day comes and to live with Him as His people for eternity, that's the whole reason for Christmas and why we celebrate Advent.

The second Sunday of Advent reminds us that because our Lord and Savior is coming to be with us we need to be prepared. On the fourth Sunday, as we all get excited about the coming of Christmas and note that the 4th Sunday is also Christmas Eve this year, we are reminded how God established His Son to be the final King of His people whose kingdom will last forever. The Angel brings the Good News of Jesus being born to Mary of Nazareth through the Holy Spirit. Mary answers, Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to Your word. Luke 1:38

May the Advent season of the beginning and end of the Church year bring you a greater understanding of the joy and blessings of Christmas and the final day of your life in this world. Amen.

Vice President of Christian Life

(4 year term) shall be coordinator of the Christian Life Department including the chairman of the Christian Life Committee, Christian Resources Editor, and LWML store manager.

Vice President of Communications

(4 year term) shall provide leadership and direction to the Tidings editor and publications manager as well as coordinate the convention publicity and be alert to district and zone news.

Recording Secretary (4 year term) records convention proceedings and meetings of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee, providing members and past presidents with minutes in a timely manner. **Treasurer** (4 year term) receives all monies and keeps an itemized record of all receipts and disbursements.
