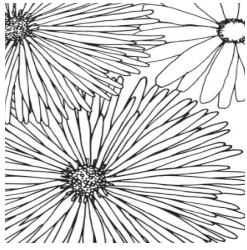

IMAGES OF STEADFASTNESS

What type of image first comes to mind when you think of the attribute "steadfast?" For me it's someone who is strong, unwavering, and immovable, such as the sentry of the King's Guard posted just outside the gates of Buckingham Palace, or the U.S. Army soldier stationed at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington. Distracting as the elements or passersby might otherwise be, the expectation is that these soldiers, chosen in large part for their steadfastness, will remain absolutely laser-focused on their duties.

Might there be other images of steadfastness, particularly within the Christian church? How about the wearied mom who juggles multiple, energetic children single-handedly at every Sunday service? Or the young man who works two poorly paying jobs just to provide for his household? Or the elderly pastor who is no longer physically able to get down on his knees, yet still diligently prays for his parishioners every morning? Can we say that these people, too, are steadfast? I think the answer to that question is a resounding "Yes!" Does that mean that the wearied mom never snaps at her children, or that the young man never complains at the end of a double-shift, or that the pastor never gets frustrated with the

very people he's praying for? Absolutely not. And that's because Christian steadfastness doesn't require the personal strength of a heavily-armed soldier. Rather, Christian steadfastness is the indwelling Holy Spirit's commitment to God, even in the middle of a broken world filled with broken people.

Such examples of steadfastness are in good company. Consider Jesus Himself. Filled with the Holy Spirit, He was fully committed to His Heavenly Father, and in that sense was strong, unwavering, and immovable. But in other ways He wasn't always a picture of personal strength. He also grew tired on occasion after days of preaching, got frustrated with His disciples when they refused to understand Him, and became distressed in the Garden over God's plan for His immediate future. Remarkably, in the most important ways, His steadfastness was an image of suffering, weakness, surrender, vulnerability, and humility. Those are things we can all relate to, by God's grace, and the same steadfastness that God bestows on each of us: a Spirit-powered commitment to Him that prays, "not My will, but Yours be done," even when we are feeling wearied and weak.

STEADFASTNESS

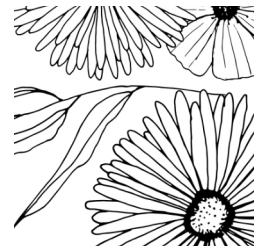

person may be caught in traffic or simply plan poorly and be late; a husband may desert his wife.

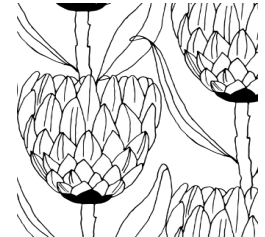
