### FAITH

The famous verse of the purpose of LWML is the Widow's Mite. And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much. And there came a certain poor widow, and she threw in two mites, which make a farthing. And he called unto him his disciples, and saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living. Mark 12:41-44 (KJV)

Historians say this was about the worth of two pennies. Can you imagine having only two pennies? What could you buy with that? Nothing really. Back in the day you could get a little candy. In some of the countries we support with mission grants, they survive on pennies a day. Beyond this, if that was all you had to your name, would you give it away? Basically this was all the widow had, with no money coming in any time soon. But she put it in the offering box for the Temple. Jesus noticed how much of a sacrifice this was for her. To me this is faith to the extreme. Giving everything you have with nothing coming in. When we tithe, we trust that our budget can support it, but we have funding coming in. She didn't. Widows in this time relied on charity from others, since they didn't have male family members to take care of them. This situation makes me nervous because it's so uncertain. I think this is why Jesus pointed it out.

Our takeaway from this could be that what we see as small and insignificant can make a difference for someone else. So even when we feel we're not doing enough, God uses this as an example of faith in giving all that we have. What a blessing!

## A GIFT OF GOD

For truly, I say to you, if you have faith like a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you. Matthew 17:20

Faith like a mustard seed. A mustard seed is tiny and yet when it is planted and grows, it can become a very big tree. Faith is a gift of God. We receive this gift when we are baptized and upon hearing the Gospel. Jesus is saying that even if you have a small amount of faith and trust in God, it is still enough to say to a mountain, move and it will move. To believe we must have faith. This is something that we cannot do on our own. Faith is external and by the power of the Holy Spirit is then made internal inside of each one of us. Martin Luther found this out by intensive study of the book of Romans, and of course, it was the Spirit that revealed this to him, so that the Church would be reminded that no matter how hard we try, faith cannot and will never come from our hearts. Our hearts are filled with evil and sinful thoughts; God alone must give us this faith and trust in Him and Him alone.

And "nothing will be impossible for you." Mary was greeted by an angel and told that she would bear the Savior of the world. How exciting and terrifying at the same time! When the angel told her that her relative Elizabeth was also pregnant, the angel said this, "For nothing will be impossible with God." The Bible shows so many situations that just can't be possible, but God shows time and time again that He is capable of doing great and impossible things. You may have an impossible situation going on right now in your life, but God says to you, wait and see what I am about to do. Sometimes things work out and sometimes they don't, for all we can pray is "Thy will be done." We put things in God's hands and that is all we can do. Have faith and trust that He will work things out according to His great mercy and love. We can certainly ask God for an increase in faith, but know that God has given you and me everything we need to carry out our various tasks in life and He will guide us every step of the way. Have faith in the God who can do great wonders even from faith as small as a mustard seed.

#### Faith in Action: Trusting in What We Cannot See

This powerful verse highlights two foundational attributes of faith: confidence in hope and assurance in the promises of God. It affirms the unseen realities of His kingdom and anchors our hope in His eternal promises. At its core, faith is both a divine gift and a daily practice—one that enables us to live generously, walk boldly, and act in trust.

Since the start of the year, we've witnessed faith in action. By God's grace and your generous giving, we have provided partial funding to all our grant recipients—and even paid two grants in full. What an incredible accomplishment! These blessings are tangible reminders that God provides, often in ways we don't immediately see.
