God also used blood at the Passover, the sacrificial sprinkling with hyssop, the Last Supper, and Jesus sweating blood as he prayed. Cheryl Mattil detailed and reminded us of some the physical aspects of what Jesus went through on the cross in order for us to be with Him in Eternity. We are cleansed by water and blood.

As a service project, the ladies tied 15 throws and 10 lap quilts. The quilt tops were sewn by ladies from Nora Sotak's group. Retreat goers were encouraged to take a quilt or throw to share in her area at home. Some ladies chose to color instead and were joined by Pastor Biberdorf.

NOMINATIONS WANTED

As Rocky Mountain District Archivist/Historian I am asking you to prayerfully consider being nominated to become a candidate for one of the following positions that are coming up for election in June 2026 at our RMD convention in Colorado Springs, CO.

All of these positions, except for the nominating committee, would entail a 4-year time commitment that would begin on June 7, 2026 and go until June 2030. The nominating committee position would be from July 2026 until the next biennium convention in June 2028. It is also expected that each executive officer writes an article for the *Tidings*, the RMD newsletter that is published 6 times per year.

President: Being President is one of the most challenging and fulfilling jobs you can have that exemplifies the true meaning of "serving the Lord with Gladness". You would be the leader of the Rocky Mountain District and be our representative at all district, zone and group events and be a member of the LWML Presidents Assembly. You would oversee 6 elected officers, coordinate appointments of 5 appointed officers & 5 special appointed personnel, and be an ex-officio member of all 10 standing committees.

VP of Gospel Outreach: Being VP of Gospel Outreach is all about Missions. You would be the coordinator of a department the consists of 5 major committees - Mission Grants, Mission Servants, Scholarship, Heart to Heart Sisters, and Deaf Ministry Liaison. As chair of the Mission Grants committee, you would oversee acceptance & review of mission grants applications, and prepare proposals for vote at each biennium convention.

VP of Servant Resources: Being VP of Servant Resources is all about encouragement through education & information, and building relationships. You would be first in line to take over the duties of President in case of emergency. You would be the coordinator of a department the consists of 3 major committees — Leader Development, Committee on Young Women, and Committee on Teens. As chair of the Leader Development Committee, you would oversee the creation and provision of ideas, techniques, and resources to aid in the process of increasing membership and interest in all aspects of being a Lutheran Woman in Mission.

Nominating Committee Member: As part of this committee, you would be one of five women from a slate of nine nominees (one from each zone) to be voted on at each RMD convention. Your duty would be to help choose two candidates for each elective office (EC officers and pastoral counselors) to be voted on for the biennium. For 2028, that would be VP Christian Life, VP Communications, Recording Secretary, and Treasurer, as well as 9 candidates for the next cycle's Nominating Committee.
