I've never been very good with patience. I am getting better with age, but it's still a hard thing to deal with. Waiting on the Lord may be even harder. He has the ability to give us our heart's desire and whatever we ask. But He doesn't. Not always. They say that the three answers to prayer are, "Yes," "No," and "Not yet." Waiting is a very hard thing. Waiting for the stop light to turn green. Waiting for the line in the supermarket or WalMart to dwindle. Waiting for grandchildren. But waiting on the Lord is something that we should be content with at all times. For Christ has come and has given us all we need. Salvation. Forgiveness of sins. Eternal life. But as sinful humans, we desire more. Enough is never enough. The Psalms can help us in our times of frustration and patience. Read them and you will see that the psalmist deals with the same things that we deal with. Longing for justice, longing for peace, longing for deliverance. Psalm 13 begins by saying, **How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me?** The psalmist feels abandoned. The psalmist feels lost. The psalmist feels alone. God has not answered his prayers and so he cries out to God. "How long?" We all have felt this way. Many, many times. Maybe right now. We feel that God has left us and moved on from us. That He doesn't care anymore. But He does. He cares for you very deeply. And just because

He has not answered your prayers in the way you want, doesn't mean that He doesn't care. He knows you and me better that we know ourselves. He is working in your life at this very second to bring all things to you in His time, and as He sees fit. He knows what is best and what is not best for us. Wait on Him and He will give you more than you deserve or desire.

And so we wait and wait and wait. **I waited patiently on the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry.** Psalm 40:1 Use the words of the Psalms to help you in your lament and grief and pain and longing and patience. In Christ, God's love is already settled. He loves you more than you know. Wait on Him and He will deliver you. Keep asking, keep praying. The Lord will answer in His time. Please pray that the Holy Spirit would grant us patience, clarity, and unity as we discern how best to support Gospel-focused work. Pray also for the ministries seeking grants—that God would guide, bless, and provide for their service in His kingdom.

May the Lord fill us with patience in the waiting, hope that rejoices, and a spirit of continual prayer as we walk forward together in faith.

PATIENCE

How do I have patience in leadership?

One of the hardest things about leadership is when things don't go as you planned. Maybe someone dropped the ball, or something unplanned popped up and all of a sudden poof! you have to refigure your plan! I completely understand. It is frustrating. 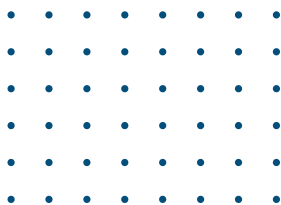

- Gently used sleeping bags can be adult or child sized
- Liners can be added to lighter weight used sleeping bags to make them warmer
- Look for climbing shoes in the climbing gear department of a sporting goods store, not in the shoe department
- Check with your kids/grandkids about used climbing shoes, they may know climbers willing to donate their extra shoes, or check in thrift stores near climbing areas
- Go together with other ladies to purchase the more expensive items or apply for a Thrivent card

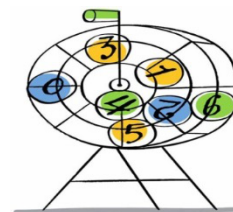

CONVENTION BANNER DIRECTIONS

The RMD Executive Committee is once again asking each zone to make a baby quilt/ lap blanket to be used as your zone banner that will be donated as part of "Gifts of the Heart" following the convention.

Suggested Size: 36" by 40"

Fabric Suggestion: Cotton Fleece, Soft Denim, Knit, Calico

Details:

- The baby quilt/lap blanket will be carried in the opening procession by the president, young woman representatives, and the teen representative from each zone.
- Zone names will be printed on a sign and handed out during processional practice and carried in by one of the zone representatives. Please have a card attached to the back of the banner on the lower right-hand side with the zone name and the person/ church/group that made the banner.
- The baby quilt/lap blanket should include a casing on the back (that will fit a 1" dowel), a 1" dowel stick with an eye screw on each end, and a cord that can be tied to each eye screw with extra cord to hang from the knot. Lay the cord flat along the rod and knot it on the outside of each screw eye. The cord (heavy enough to support the weight of the banner) will stretch when the banner is hung.
- Each zone provides a banner pole and stand. Each zone will be assigned a spot for their banner.

Zone Banners will be displayed in the assigned banner area throughout the convention. Zones are welcome and encouraged to make more than one quilt/blanket; however, only one quilt/lap blanket will be used in the opening procession. Quilt/lap blanket designs may be based on the convention logo but is not required. Any theme, design, or color is acceptable. Talk to your zone president to submit an idea for your quilt/ lap blanket banner design. Let's put these banners to work as we share Jesus' love with others.
